### Toronto Universities' French Contest / Le Concours de français des universités torontoises April 26, 2019 - University of Toronto, St. George Campus

### **Rules and Regulations**

The contest is open to students enrolled in a Toronto, Peel, Durham or York Region secondary school both during the year of the contest and the year preceding it. Students must be Canadian citizens or landed immigrants, and must have completed or be currently enrolled in Grade 11 or 12 French. Students will participate in one of four categories:

Grade 11 Core French

Grade 12 Core French

Grade 12 Core French plus

Grade 12 Extended/Immersion French

Each participating school may send a maximum of two students per category, and a maximum of six students in total (two Grade 11 students and four Grade 12 students). Native French speakers and students enrolled in a French-language secondary school are not eligible. Students who have won a prize in a previous Toronto Universities' French Contest are not eligible. Students must fill out the application form and indicate the category which corresponds to the type of French program in which they are currently enrolled. Students who have switched from one type of program to another over the course of their primary and/or secondary studies should choose the category which they believe corresponds most closely to their background in French, and provide all relevant details on the application form. The organizing committee reserves the right to place students in the category that they deem the most appropriate, and to refuse students whose background in French does not correspond to any of the categories. Students must submit the completed form to their teacher. Teachers must then verify the information, and submit the completed application to the address indicated at the bottom of the form. Applications must be received by March 22nd, 2019 to be considered.

# Categories

# **Core French**

This category is designed for non-francophone students who have followed the regular Core French curriculum in elementary and secondary school and who have not had any special opportunities to learn French (e.g. exchange programs, summer courses in French, etc).

#### **Core French Plus**

This category is designed for non-francophone students currently enrolled in a core program, but who were enrolled in an extended or immersion program in primary school, or who have had considerable exposure to French through exchange programs, summer courses, etc.

#### **French Extended/Immersion**

This contest is designed for non-francophone students who are currently enrolled in an Extended French or French Immersion program.
